been Captain of the 10th Cavalry, a colored regiment, prior to his coming here in 1905. Hay remained for four years, so that his four sons could attend the College.

In 1939 Hay, a Major-General retired, returned for the reunion of the class of 1909. According to Hibshman, the General was a "well-preserved, delightful old gentleman, who still wanted to be called 'Hep' in preference to 'General'."

About three years ago Hay returned again. This time to attend the dedication services for 26th division shrine in Boalsburg. General Hay had commanded the Army of the Argonne (of which the 28th division was a part) in World War I. At this service the General again called Hibshman and a classmate by name. He was about 80 years old at that time.

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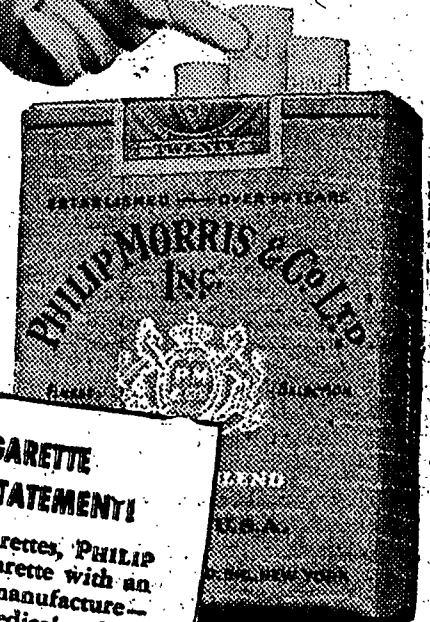
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
