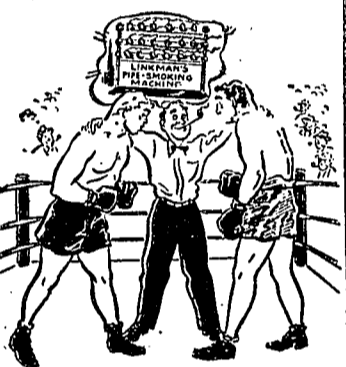
Miss Harrington Named Mortar Board President

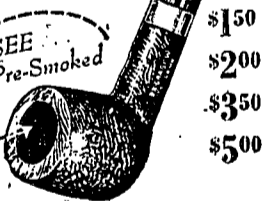

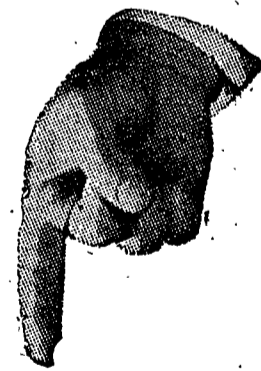
