

## Nittany Skiers Capture Title

Penn State's ski team turned in a fine all-around performance to capture the Pennsylvania State Ski Championships at Ligonier over the weekend.

A crowd of over 300 jammed the Laurel Mountain Slopes to watch the slalom, cross-country and downhill events, staged under near-perfect snow conditions.

George Quimby turned in two outstanding performances for the Lion ski team as he made a beautiful run in the downhill event to miss taking first place from Paul Massey of Cleveland by a second, and came in behind Max Peters of Penns Valley in the cross-country run.

### PETERS BEST

Peters, one of three Penn State former ski captains participating in the competition, was named the outstanding skier of the meet on the basis of 280.6 points.

Bud James, who had previously taken fourth place in the cross-country, suffered a broken leg as he crossed the finish line in the downhill. He was taken to Johnstown Hospital.

Despite one costly fall, Hank Thurston, winner last week of the Penns Valley Ski Club Championships, placed fifth in the slalom.
