 Welfare. (d) All dances and house parties shall be provided with at least two chaperones. The dates of the dances and the names of the chaperones shall be filed with the Dean of Women at least one week before the event.

Hours
 (e) Dancing at house parties and at class and all-college dances shall not continue later than 1 a.m. on Friday night and 12 o'clock midnight on Saturday night.

(f) The presidents of the several organizations giving dances and house parties shall be held responsible for taking proper steps to secure the observance of these rules by both active and alumni members and guests.

(g) The Committee on Student Welfare will hold the organization giving a dance responsible for the good moral conduct of all persons attending the dance, and will penalize neglectful organizations.

Drinking
 Rule 95. The College forbids the serving or use of alcoholic beverages at any social function in which minors or women students are participating.

This action is consistent with the State Liquor Code which makes it a violation of law to sell or give intoxicating liquors to minors, and with the regulations of the Women's Student Government Association disapproving drinking by women students and reserving the right to punish violators.

Violations
 Evidence of violations of this rule will be accepted by the Committee on Student Welfare as sufficient cause for suspending indefinitely the charter or, or for inflicting lesser penalties on, any fraternity or club operating under the authority of the College.

(a) If and when any violation of these provisions (Rule 94 and 95) is reported, the fraternity or group concerned shall be notified by the Dean of Men or the Dean of Women that its social privileges are suspended until the case can be heard and proper action taken.
