

Shortlidge Road Closed, Excavating Nearing Completion

Excavation for one of the two permanent dormitories facing Shortlidge road is complete except for one small wing of the building. Top soil has been moved to the north side of the project for future use in landscaping.

Pollock road extension leading into Shortlidge road is closed to vehicles. "Shovels excavating for the new dormitories and the Pollock road extension have joined, making the road impassable," George W. Ebert, superintendent of grounds and buildings, explained yesterday.

All three of the temporary off-classroom units being built between White and Grange Halls will have roofs on them by the end of the week. The structures are scheduled for completion in July and for occupancy August 1.

Will Students Romp With Kites, Kiddies In CDT Contest?

Whether students will be allowed to romp with State College youngsters and townspeople in the Centre Daily Times Kite-Flying Tournament scheduled to start Saturday, April 26, at 9 a.m., is the question officials are trying to decide.

The events include the largest flying kite, the highest flying kite, and the kite making the best construction and artistic appearance.
