

Rabbi Speaks At Chapel

Rabbi Morris Lieberman of Baltimore, Md., will speak on the topic, "Is God Necessary?" at chapel service Sunday morning in Schwab Auditorium.

Rabbi Lieberman has occupied the pulpit of the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation in Baltimore for ten years. He was graduated from and ordained a rabbi by the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati in 1934.

He entered the service in 1941 and served in the United States, England and France with the Third Armored Division and the First Army.
