

Committee to Act on Appropriations

Recommendations for the state biennial appropriations to the college will be made by the Senate's Appropriations Committee within "a week or so," today said Senator Leroy E. Chapman (R-Ferret), chairman of the committee.

This statement came after a meeting of the committee in which President Ralph D. Hetzel stressed the need for increased college expenditures.

Appropriations of approximately \$10,000,000 for ordinary operating expenses, faculty salaries, and routine expenditures have been requested for the next biennium. Gov. James H. Duff in his budget message to the General Assembly recently recommended a \$8,500,000 allotment.

Senator A. H. Letzler (R-Clearfield) proposed this week a \$6,000,000 supplementary appropriation in addition to the regular appropriations which the College will receive. This money would be used to construct both temporary and permanent housing for faculty members and the student body, and permanent construction of academic buildings.
