

Baseball Game Rained Out; Lions Meet Pitt Twice Away

With yesterday's game with Gettysburg rained out, Joe Bedenk's Nittany Lion baseball club is preparing for a two-game series with the Pitt Panthers in Pittsburgh Friday and Saturday.

The rains came yesterday two hours before game time and then let up, with even a ray of sun appearing by 4 o'clock, but the officials ruled that the infield was too wet for a game.

Bedenk stated that he would start Ken Yount, winner of the two Lion victories this season, on the mound for Friday's game with the once-beaten Panthers. Yount was scheduled to start yesterday against Gettysburg.

It will be Bob Gehrett pitching for the Lions in Saturday's game, Bedenk indicated. Gehrett put out the fire last Saturday when Georgetown jumped on Bill Benyish and Art Bohard for ten runs in the first two innings of the second game.
