Lacrossemen Meet Colgate, Hobart in Weekend Matches

At full strength for the first time since the Loyola game, the Penn State lacrosse team leaves this afternoon for a brace of weekend encounters with Colgate and Hobart.

Victorious in their last three starts, the Lion stickmen are beginning to round into a more potent aggregation because of continued practice sessions and early season contest experience.

Coach Nick Thiel is confident of a good showing against the New York teams, and has high hopes of capturing at least one of the engagements.

Colgate, who plays host to the Lions at Hamilton at 4 o'clock tomorrow afternoon, dropped its last two games, to Sampson and Hobart. Sampson, drubbed by the State lacrossemen 8-2 last week, eked out a 7-6 win over the Red Raiders.

On Saturday, the Thielmen journey to Geneva for a 2:30 o'clock encounter with Hobart. One of the top lacrosse schools in the country, the Hobart squad boasts a record of five wins and two losses.
