mittee meeting rooms, and storage rooms for operating supplies. The dormitories are financed 100 per cent by the College, the dining hall by the FWA.

Work on the temporary classrooms building, constructed north of White Hall, may be finished this month, Ebert said. The laboratory and shop building erected on College Farm 13, along Township Road, is also nearly completed.

The dining hall, classroom, laboratory, and shop buildings were obtained by the College under the provisions of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act and moved to the campus from Fort Washington, Md.

Ebert also reported that the ex-

tension of Pollock Road from Shortlidge Road to the newly-constructed State Highway east of Pollock Circle has been completed except for the finishing coat which won't be added until construction in that area is finished.

sky, the keyboard accompanist, conducted opera in Kiev and Kharkov, and has composed three symphonies, a ballet, an opera, and motion picture background music.

Organized in 1945, the ensemble had presented 50 concerts by Christmas of last year. The New York Times praised its "grasp of the Russian style and idiom," while the Chicago Sun described its work as "polished and comprehensible." All critics welcomed the rarely-heard Russian music.

Mr. Kozakevich, baritone, was encouraged by the great Chaliapin. Mr. Tamarin is considered the leading Russia tenor in America today. Pianist Rudnitsky studied under Artur Schnabel and Egon Petri.

en's dormitories now being built. The College expansion program will be advanced by such a measure of construction as can be provided in these days by the sum of \$750,000, the President stated.

Dr. Hetzel indicated that plans for the academic buildings will be carried out as fully as funds available will permit. To what extent can not be determined until bids are received from contractors.

The College enrollment in September of this year will not be affected by the appropriations cut. If the women's dormitory is completed by the fall of 1948, the enrollment for that year will probably not be seriously affected, the President said.
