"Much of the flavor of folk songs is in their unknown origins, according to Miss Reed, who readily admits that J. J. Niles, for one, a collector of folk music, has written original songs and passed them off as genuine ballads.

Miss Reed, a Victor Record recording artist, has chosen from several versions of a single ballad in many cases to get the rendition that she sings at concerts

and on her disks.
