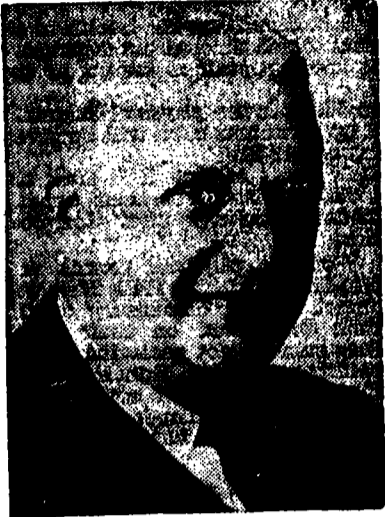


Deans of Schools Welcome Incoming Sophomores

Gilbert Succeeds Fleming As Athletic Office Head

Harold R. "Ike" Gilbert has been appointed graduate manager of athletics, the School of Physical Education and Athletics, succeeding Neil M. Fleming, President Ralph Dorn Hetzel announced this week.

Fleming, who announced his retirement effective September 1, had been associated with Penn State athletics since 1910 as student, layer and administrator, and Gilbert had served as his assistant in the graduate manager's office for 10 of those 37 years.

In approving Gilbert's appointment, the executive committee of the board of trustees voted to remove the graduate manager of athletics from the duties of the graduate manager of Associated Student Activities and authorized officers of the College to provide for management of the A. S. A. in some other way.

Former Track Manager

The two men have been closely associated in intercollegiate athletics for a quarter of a century. Fleming had previously served for four years as a student manager and had filled the post of varsity track manager the year preceding his appointment as assistant.

Fleming and Gilbert were the only two men ever to fill the assistant graduate manager's job, since it was especially created to bring Fleming into the athletic office in 1914, and then discontinued from 1918, when Fleming was named graduate manager, until Gilbert was added as Fleming's assistant in 1926.

The new appointee is the sixth man to fill the graduate manager's shoes. George R. Meek, re-

tired postmaster of Bellefonte. Henry C. McIlveen and P. Edwin Thomas: each served for one-year periods after the office was created in 1908, followed by Ray H. Smith, who continued until his appointment as College Comptroller in 1918. Fleming has been graduate manager for the 29 years since.

Promote Athletic Programs

During the 25 years that Fleming and Gilbert have been associated in the athletic office, Penn State has forged steadily forward and now maintains intercollegiate schedules in 17 varsity sports. The two have held responsible positions in Eastern athletic groups, and have been key figures in the promotion of the present-day intercollegiate athletic program.

Like Fleming, Gilbert has been an avid follower of all sports, and an unbroken attendance record at football games, and has missed few other athletic events either at home or away. One of Fleming's proudest boasts is the fact that he had been absent from only two of the 316 football games in which Penn State had played since he came to the campus as a student in 1910.
