

Land Grant College Officials To Discuss National Problems

National problems as they relate to higher education will get the full attention of the American Association of Land-Grant Colleges and Universities at its meetings November 10 to 12 in the Willard and Washington Hotels Washington, D. C., Dr. Ralph Dorn Hetzel, president, said.

In senate meetings and in general assembly, officials of these land-grant universities will discuss such timely topics as universal military training, federal aid to higher education, proposed legislation on the National Science Foundation, veterans' affairs in general, and the proposed federal department of health, education and welfare.

"Because of the public character and the traditions of public service, which have developed about our land-grant colleges and universities, they are destined to grow in strength and influence," Dr. Hetzel predicts.

But in addition to meeting the current problems resulting from the influx of thousands of veterans, Dr. Hetzel, who also is president of the Pennsylvania State College, believes our institutions must also look to the years ahead.

"A new concept recognizing students as individuals is apparent, and new emphasis must be placed on the humanities if we are to prepare our young people for their place as citizens of the world," Dr. Hetzel said.

Before the general sessions of the association begin, committees will convene in preliminary meetings on November 7 to 9. Special unit meetings also are scheduled for the agricultural, engineering, home economics, and the arts and science divisions. Dr. Russell I. Thackray, of Washington, D.C., is executive secretary-treasurer of the association.

Kurtz Joins Psych Staff

Dr. Albert K. Kurtz, who has been appointed professor of psychology at the College, comes to Penn State from Michigan State College.

A graduate of Stanford University, Dr. Kurtz served as a research assistant there, then joined the faculty of Ohio State University where he received his doctor of philosophy degree in 1930.

After leaving Ohio State, Dr. Kurtz became an assistant in personnel research for the Civil Service Commission; a statistician for Procter and Gamble Co., Cincinnati, Ohio; research associate for the Life Insurance Sales Research Bureau, Hartford,

Conn.; and a lecturer and associate professor at Yale University, New Haven, Conn.

In 1942, Dr. Kurtz was named project director for Radio Code Research Project in Chicago, Ill., and then became research associate for Life Insurance Management Association, Hartford, Conn. During the war, he served as expert consultant to the Secretary of War in the Adjutant General's Department.

Dr. Kurtz has contributed articles to numerous magazines and has done extensive research in the development of selection tests and procedures for life insurance salesmen and sales managers.
