State, W. Virginia Clash In East's Top Rated Game

Penn State and West Virginia come to grips Saturday in what shapes up as one of the East's top football games.

The game, 14th in a series started in 1904, brings together on New Beaver Field two of the nation's high-scoring teams. An overflow crowd of 20,000 is expected to be on hand for the kickoff at 2 p.m.

The Mountaineers have racked up a total of 194 points so far this season, defeating Otterbein, Washington and Lee, Waynesburg and N.Y.U.

The West Virginia squad is more or less an unknown quantity despite the high scores piled up against their opponents. None of the four teams they have played are classed as first rate, but, according to Coach Bob Higgins, the Mountaineers are really loaded this year.

Saturday's game, the first between these two teams since 1944, will find Bill Kern, Mountaineer coach, cast in a new role. Heretofore a strong disciple of the single wing, the West Virginia mentor has switched to the T and has enjoyed unusual success with it. The Kern T is a combination of the Notre Dame and Army styles, plus variations of his own.
