

Fall Theme Keynotes Fraternity Parties

Colorful Fall and Hallowe'en themes will keynote most fraternity Houseparty celebrations tomorrow night as 34 houses spotlight the weekend's entertainment finale with a gala review of parties and dances.

Although the predominant autumn motif has kept social chairmen hustling variegated leaves, crisp corn shocks, and big fleshy pumpkins into chapter and social rooms, several houses have departed radically from the general trend in favor of more unusual themes.
