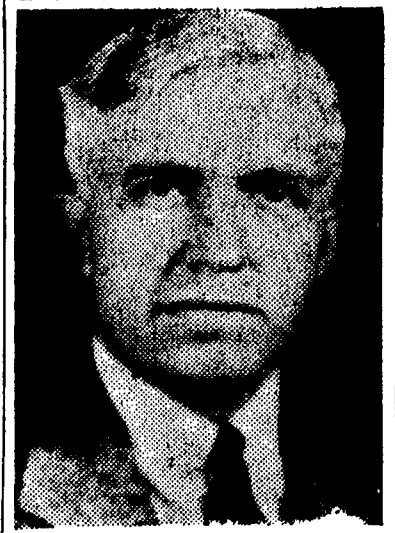
Dr. Traube Guest of Honor At Anniversary Dinner

Dr. and Mrs. M. R. Traube were honored at a dinner held by the School of Education at the Nittany Lion Inn Wednesday to mark the 10th anniversary of Dr. Traube's appointment as dean of the School of Education and director of the Summer Sessions at the College.

Dr. Traube was named dean of the school and director of Summer Sessions in 1937 after he had served on the faculty of the University

of North Carolina for 15 years. He succeeded Dean Will Grant Chambers, first dean of the School of Education at the College, who retired in 1937.

Commenting on the future for the School of Education, Dean

Trabue said that the School should be judged by the quality, rather than the quantity of its graduates. He also stated that graduates of the School should be prepared to be leaders in education for democracy and that it therefore was necessary for them to receive their training in a democratic institution.

Dean Traube also told the 105 faculty, staff members, and friends who attended the dinner that graduates of the School of Education must be community-minded citizens and therefore urged closer relations between the College and the community here.

Dr. Robert G. Bernreuter, professor of psychology, represented the faculty of the School and offered congratulations to the Dean and Mrs. Traube. He also cited the progress that has been made in the School during the past ten years and mentioned the outstanding work that Dean Traube had done in national education circles. Telegrams of congratulations from Governor James Duff and Superintendent of Public Instruction Francis A. Haas, as well as other prominent leaders in education, were read.

Among the guests attending the anniversary dinner were Mrs. Clara C. Phillips and George Arisman, trustees of the College; Dr. Carl P. Schott, dean of the School of Physical Education and Athletics, and Mrs. Schott; Dr. H. P. Hammond, dean of the School of Engineering, and Mrs. Hammond; Dr. George L. Haller, acting dean of the School of Chemistry and Physics, and Mrs. Haller; Dr. Pearl O. Weston, dean of women; and Dr. Ben Euwema, dean of the School of Liberal Arts.
