

Lambda Chi Leads IFC Bowling

Manhattan's decisive victory in the Metropolitan Cross-country race Tuesday placed them as a team that will give the Penn State harriers considerable opposition this Saturday. Although Armand Osterberg, NYU runner, paced the field to come in first, the Jaspers took second, third, and fifth places to win the 16th annual meet. This race marked the first time in eight years that NYU has been dethroned as the New York City champions.

"The New York meet bears out my contention that we have one of the toughest schedules in the nation," stated Coach Werner. "We defeated NYU, last year's national champions, but Saturday we have to face another top team."

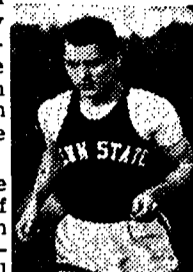

61 Lacrossemen Practice Daily

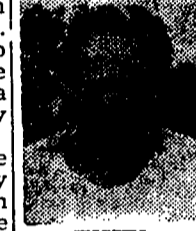
