Cwen-WRA Orphan

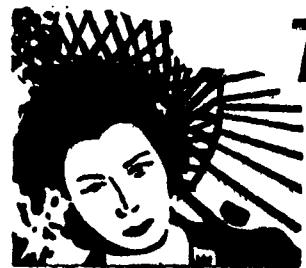
