Aid Thru Taxation

WASHINGTON — President Truman indicated last night that he felt the billions of dollars it will cost to aid Europe should come from direct taxation. The President said that taxation rather than borrowing should finance the cost of aid under the Marshall Plan.

Chancellor Resigns

LONDON — British Chancellor of the Exchequer, Hugh Dalton, resigned yesterday after admitting he had disclosed some tax secrets to a newspaper reporter just before his message to Parliament Wednesday.

The Minister of Economics, Sir Stafford Cripps, will succeed Dalton as head of Britain's treasury.

Meyers Held Stock

WASHINGTON — At the Howard Hughes hearings yesterday, the Senate War Investigators were told by an Ohio firm that Major Bennett Meyers held aviation stock worth \$35,000 when he reported to his superiors that he had no such holdings. Meanwhile Howard Hughes has a refund coming from the Government—nearly \$456,000 in income tax overpayments. The Treasury announced that the refund and credits are for overpayments by Hughes in 1945-46.

Renewed Violence

PALESTINE—The most violent wave of disorders against the British in the past six weeks broke out in Jerusalem and Haifa last night. Six British men were reported killed and 22 others wounded in grenade and gun attacks.
