At least three universities plan to send delegates to the College this weekend to discuss plans for organizing a National Junior Women's Honorary, Nancy Ault, president of Junior Service Board, local Junior Women's honorary, said today.

Colleges sending representatives are University of Pennsylvania, Temple and Ohio State University. West Virginia University, Ohio University, Cornell, and University of Louisville, Ky., also have local chapters and have been extended invitations, but their representation at the conference isn't definite, said Miss Ault.

Junior Service Board became an active organization on campus in 1941 when the need for a junior women's honorary to help in the orientation of transfer women was realized.

The group was chartered under supervision of WSGA and given the responsibility of the orientation of transfer women, and distribution of the Point System, a regulatory system used for women's activities which has since been discarded. Dr. Pearl O. Weston, then assistant dean of women, was the club's advisor.

The torch and scroll were chosen as the symbol and the same Junior Service Board was selected as typifying the activities of the organization.

This Fall Junior Service Board successfully met its task of taking charge in the orientation of all sophomore and junior transfer women.

The 30 active Junior Service Board members have taken over the duty of the Senior Sponsors, and meet monthly with the transfers to talk over any pertinent problems about college activities. The organization is considered one of the Hat Societies and it is a member of Hat Societies Council.

Girls are chosen for Junior Service Board at the end of their sophomore year on the basis of high scholarship and extra-curricular activities. A member of WSGA cannot be tapped for Junior Service Board.

## Coed Coordinating Committee Investigates Permissions

Blanket permission at twenty-four colleges and universities in the country are being investigated by the Coed Coordinating Committee, headed by Virginia McCluskey, WSGA senior senator.

A letter of inquiry, sent out to the women's governing body in these schools, requests information on the type of blanket permission used, the set-up of the system, the length of time the system has been functioning, the number of women students enrolled at the school, and the general attitude of the students, dean of women, and hostesses toward this system.

Samples of any rules and regulation forms in the administration of the system are also requested. Replies are expected before December 18 and action will be taken by WSGA soon after Christmas vacation.

The schools being contacted in the investigation were selected from members of the Intercollegiate Association of Women Students. The committee tried to choose those schools having an enrollment comparable to the College.

Among the twenty-four institutions being studied, the better known are Cornell University,

Northwestern University, Oklahoma A. and M., University of Michigan, University of Southern California, Purdue University, Miami University, Wayne University, Bowling Green State University, and University of California.
