

## Nordblom Replaces Kulp Tonight; Boxing Finals Feature 8 Bouts

Eight bouts will feature the finals of the 1947 intramural boxing tournament which will begin immediately following the varsity basketball game with Bucknell tonight.

The Sigma Nu's, with five men vying for individual titles, have practically clinched the team championship, won last year by Delta Upsilon.

One defending champion and two runners-up are on tonight's schedule. Fritz Lenox, Sigma Nu, 165 pound king last year, will meet Bob Hicks of Delta Upsilon in the 175 class. Last year's runners-up, KDR John McCreary and PiKA Ed Hanford meet formidable foes in Tommy Halligan, Sigma Nu and the Phi Delta's Frank Mattern. Halligan eliminated defending champion George Schautz, Delta Upsilon, in the 128 pound semi-finals.

Delta Upsilon, Phi Delta Theta, and Sigma Chi, are the only other fraternities with two men in the championship fights.

## Lions Boast Nation's Best Pass Defense Percentage

Southern Methodist, beware! Only 27.2 percent of opponents' passes found their mark within a stout 1947 Penn State gridiron defense.

This statistical gem, released yesterday by the National Collegiate Athletic Bureau, revealed that the 1947 Nittany Lions deployed the most effective pass defense (on a percentage basis) in the nation, and surprised many Penn State skeptics who thought the Lions' defense was "good on

an over-all basis but putty in the hand of a fair opposing passer."

However, what is no doubt a better aerial attack than Penn State encountered all season will be peppering Lion defenses with a volley of passes when State and Southern Methodist tangle New Year's Day.

On the usual basis of yards yielded per game, North Carolina State copped the national title for pass defense.
