

Biery Tops Lion Cage Scorers

By making 95 field goals and 70 foul shots, Jack Biery, captain of the Nittany Lion basketball team, took scoring honors for the 1947-48 season with 260 points.

In pacing the team, Biery also captured the foul shooting title by missing only 23 out of 90 shots from the charity stripe. His percentage was 75.5%.

Sparkplug Milt Simon placed second in team scoring with 143 markers, and Irv Batnick followed him with 135.

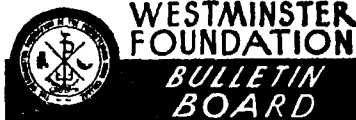
