

Cabinet Studies Job Agency Plans

Questionnaires concerning the establishment of a student-managed employment agency were mailed to 35 colleges and universities by the All-College Cabinet committee studying this problem.

The purpose of the questionnaires is to find what type of agency now being operated is closest to the one which the committee will recommend for adoption on this campus.

Information on types of management, the mode of financing, the population of the community, and the type of school queried are expected to be obtained from the answers to the forms. Replies are expected within two weeks.

Abram Bosler, chairman of the committee, made a progress report on the status of the proposed employment agency to Cabinet last Thursday night. A further report will be rendered once the replies have been tabulated and analyzed.

The forms were prepared by the Cabinet employment agency committee in conjunction with Allan Reece, head of the student employment office.

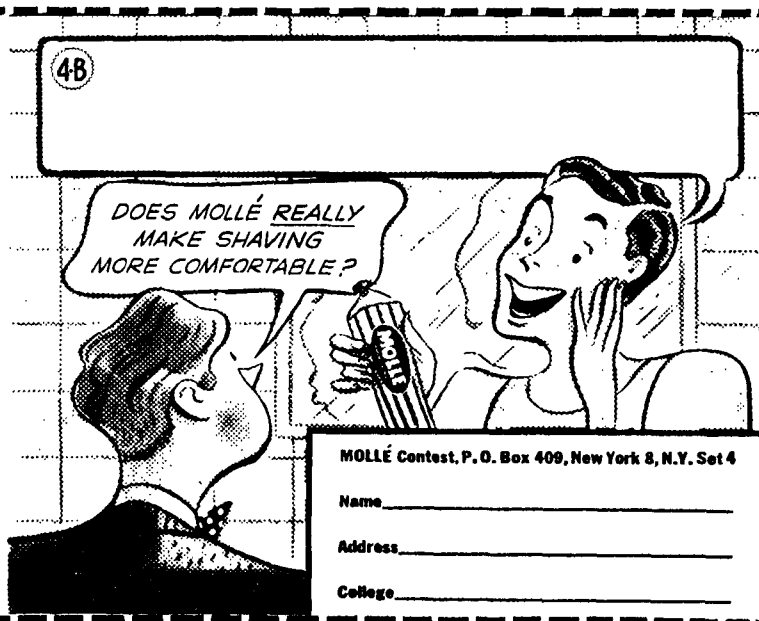

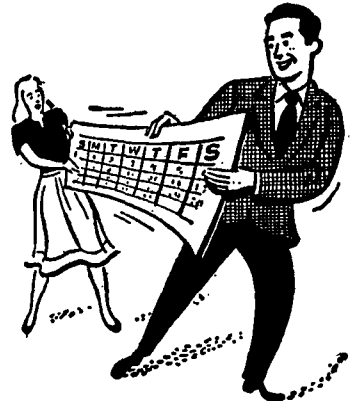
