tion where discrimination is condoned and encouraging inter-racial discussion groups.)

3. Student Union. (advocates continuing SU committee, recommending alteration to the plan from time to time, and informing the student body of findings of joint survey-tour group.)

4. Field House. (proposes discussion with field house committee in order to include practice areas for major sports, space for intra-mural sports, provisions for indoor track meets, seating space for indoor sports. Space for athletic activity not to be sacrificed for offices.)

5. Student Advisory System. (proposes a committee to study joint methods giving more attention to individuals.)

6. System of rating professors. (proposes setting up a committee of school councils to study the program.)

7. College appropriations. (proposes a student committee to consult with the administration and advocates that Cabinet direct its support towards securing appropriations.)

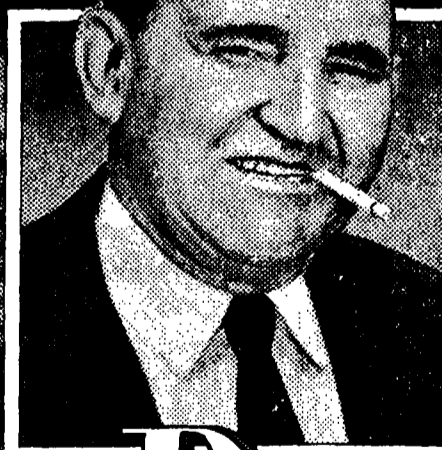
