Getting Ready

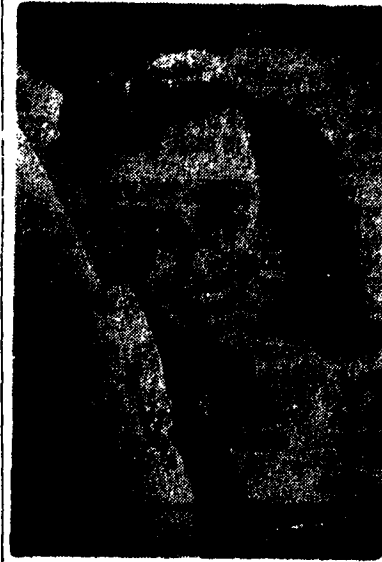

For more particulars about the Queen, she weighs 110 pounds, and bubbles over with personal-

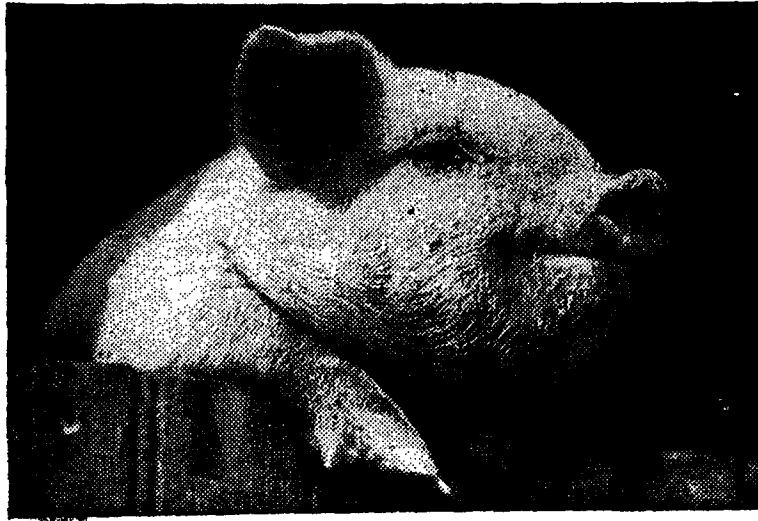
