

Map Students Display Aerial Mosaic in MI

An aerial mosaic of Centre County, made up of 400 aerial photographs mounted on a plywood backing, has been prepared by 25 students of the map evaluation class, and is on display in 106 Mineral Industries building.

On the mosaic, Central Pennsylvania's forested highlands stand out in sharp contrast to its belts of agricultural valleys. College and other buildings, highways, streams, and farm lands are clearly distinguishable.

Uses of such a mosaic include instruction in map interpretation and assistance in studying slopes of farming areas, according to Dr. E. Wilhard Miller, chief of the division of geography.

He explained that in making the four-by-ten-foot mosaic, students used aerial pictures taken by a government agricultural agency. The most difficult part of the six-month job was in accurately matching the photographs, he said.
