New equipment for the Mechanical Engineering Laboratory valued at almost \$4000 has been received at the College during the past month, Prof. Norman R. Sparks, head of the ME department, said yesterday.

The equipment includes a 55 horsepower diesel engine and 50 horsepower gasoline engine, both obtained from the International Harvester Company. These two engines, tractor type internal combustion motors, have been set up in the laboratory for use in student tests.

A demonstration dry ice machine which converts liquid carbon dioxide into its solid form has also been obtained, as a gift, from the Frick Co. of Waynesboro, Pa.
