

Journalism Student Receives \$50 Pan Hellenic Scholarship

Lois Bloomquist, sixth semester journalism student, was awarded the \$50 Pan-Hellenic Scholarship, according to Frances Keeney, scholarship chairman. The choice of the scholarship committee was announced at the final meeting of the Pan-Hel Council Tuesday night.

Miss Bloomquist, who is wire editor of Collegian, is also a member of Chimes, French Club and Great Books Club.

The Council, upon recommendation of the scholarship committee, decided to buy a new cup to be awarded every semester to the sorority having the highest scholastic average for the preceding term. The name of the winning group will be engraved upon the cup. The first to have their name placed on the cup will be Alpha Chi Omega who made the highest average in the 1947 Spring semester. The cup, however, will be given to Zeta Tau Alpha who had the highest average last semester.

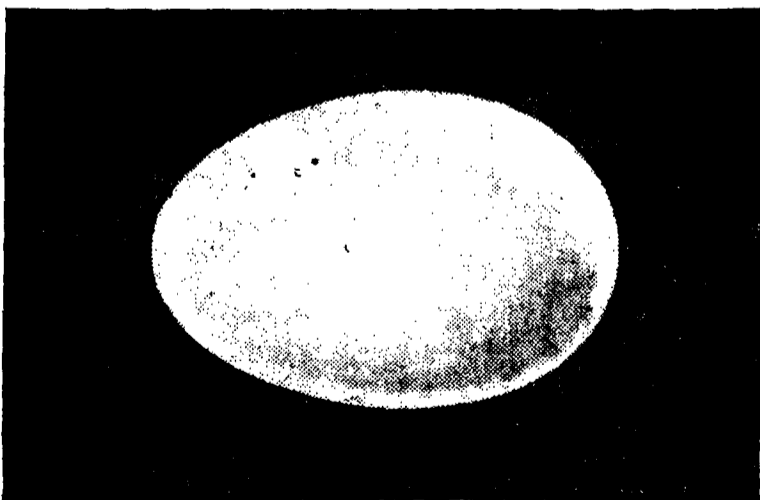
