

Alumni Poll Selects Tough Slate For Penn State Football Combine

There are no "breathers" on the football schedule proposed by old grads in a nation-wide poll of Penn State alumni. And the ideal schedule always would include Pitt and Penn.

In a mail vote conducted by the Penn State Alumni Association, incomplete returns today indicated that Nittany Lion grads would like the opposition to come largely from the ranks of Eastern powers.

Only schools outside of the East to win a sizeable bloc of votes were Notre Dame and Ohio State. In the East, Pitt and Penn led the pack, followed by Army, Navy, Cornell, Columbia and Syracuse.

Alumni officials said it was still

too early to tell how these schools would rank in the final standings. But it was clear that the two top spots would go to Pitt and Penn.

Both Pitt and Penn will be played in 1948. Syracuse also is booked. But Navy will be missing, for the first time in five years. None of the other teams mentioned in the poll have appeared on recent Penn State schedules.

The poll, which has attracted votes from alumni outside of the country, was conducted with the sanction of athletic officials and is intended to serve as a long-range guide in the compilation of football schedules.

Lion Golfers in Title Play

Penn State's Eastern championship golf team is scheduled to start National Collegiate title play at Stanford University, Stanford, Cal., Sunday. The tournament will continue through July 3.

Coach Both Rutherford, Sr., now in his 27th year at the Lion helm,

has sent six of his top-flight golfers to the Nationals.

Bob Rutherford, Jr., assistant coach, and manager Walter Kuenzi head the Nittany Lion delegation.

Representing the Eastern champions are Captain Don Hart, Jerry and Tom Smith, Al Hack, Joe Boyle and Jim Noble. Only Tom Smith, a sophomore, is a non-senior.

Hart is the foremost player on the team which won 77 of a possible 90 points while sweeping its

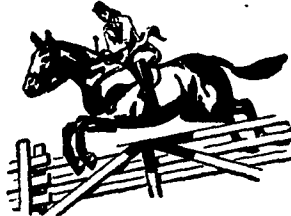
first title in the Eastern Inter-collegiate Golf Association. He played the No. 1 position in the team's ten winning matches.

Without an outstanding star, the 1948 squad is rated the best-balanced team ever to come under the direction of the veteran Rutherford.

It's the first unbeaten team for the Nittany Lions since 1935 and the fourth escape unscathed since Rutherford launched the golf game at Penn State.
