A sample poll of incoming freshmen at Penn State indicated that the vast majority of non-veterans will have completed at least one year of college before they become eligible for the draft.

William S. Hoffman, dean of admissions, said approximately half of the class will be wiped out before the start of the sophomore year and that practically all others will reach draft age either before or during their third year of study.

He said the sampling, in which he picked 200 forms at random from files containing approximately 3500 admissions, disclosed that only 20 per cent of the incoming freshmen are war veterans. He found no male student who is likely to finish four years of study before his 19th birthday.
