The Lion harriers, National Collegiate champions last year, will face New York University, Michigan State, Cornell and Manhattan in dual meets.

## Goffberg Gains Olympic Berth Despite Injury

Twenty-seven-year-old Herman Goffberg, the first Penn State to win a place on the United States Olympic track team, was barred by injuries throughout his college career. But in the years since he has come a long way.

As an undergraduate, he was held back by injuries practically every year although he did manage to compete for the 1941 cross-country team which won runner-up honors at the National Collegiate championship. Curt Stone, National AAU 5000-meter champion and Norm Gordon, assistant Lion coach, also were members of the team.

The slightly-built, 140-pound Philadelphian was hospitalized in his sophomore year, stepped on a stone and tore some ligaments in his third year, and had his appendix removed as a senior. Withal he won the National Junior AAU 1000-meter event in 1942, and finished third in the senior event.

He clinched his place on the Olympic team by finishing third, 150 yards, behind the winner, Eddie O'Toole, of New York, in the National AAU 10,000-meters race. Fred Wilt, former Indiana University star, was second and by prior arrangement the first three runners were accredited to the U.S. Olympic team.

N.Y.U., Cornell, Michigan State and Manhattan will oppose the National championship Penn State cross-country team in 1948.
