### Furbay Talks on Global Minds

Dr. John H. Furbay, director of Air World Education and noted explorer, scientist, author and educator, will speak at the Pennsylvania Superintendents and Principals Conference annual dinner in Nittany Lion Inn at 6:30 o'clock tonight on "Global Minds for a Global World."

At 11 a.m. he will speak to teachers attending the Pennsylvania Workshop in 3 Carnegie Hall. This talk will be open to the public.

Air World Education is an organization devoted to interpreting our air world responsibilities. Furbay, who travels an estimated 100,000 air miles annually, was once president of the College of West Africa, Monrovia, Liberia, and also a collector for the American Museum of Natural History and Field Museum.

He has edited the widely syndicated newspaper column "Debunker." He is author of several books on folklore, nature, history, sociology and education.

His hobby is tracing down the truth behind popular fallacies, superstitions, and historical errors.

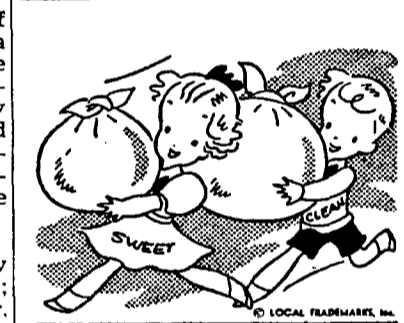

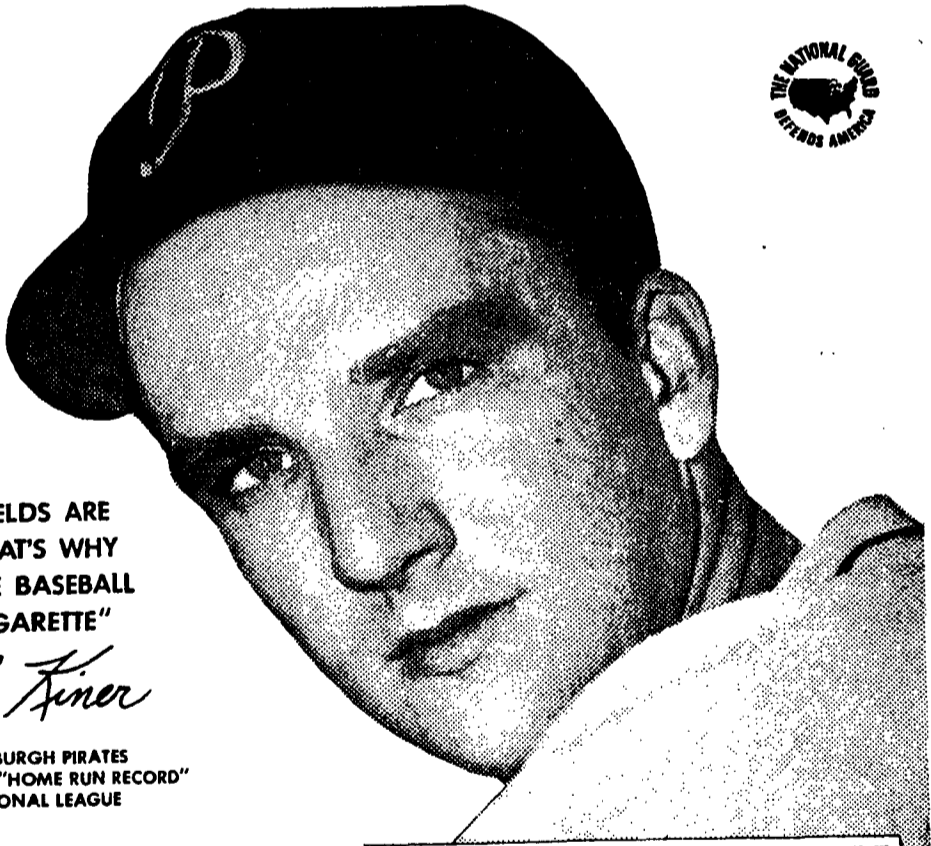
