 Terry has played comed roles with the Metropolitan Comic Opera of New York City and spent 14 years in the same capacity with the Chautauqua, N. Y. Opera Association. During the war he performed for 2 million members of the armed forces.

WSGA Tries Dorm Councils

An experiment in women's student government has been on trial this summer.
 Under the auspices of WSGA, house councils were organized for each undergraduate living unit. The councils were composed of two senators, appointed by the regular WSGA, two checkers, a president and vice president elected by the residents, and the hostess of each living unit acting as an advisor.
 The councils functioned separately for each dormitory. They served the dual role of an executive body which made and interpreted existing WSGA rules, and also acted as a judiciary committee which tried offenders and prescribed penalties.
 On alternate weeks the councils from Atherton, Grange, MacAllister and Watts Halls, met in the dean of women's office to discuss general problems and formulate a policy.
 At the end of Main Session each council will hand in a report estimating the success of this project in their particular unit. If the reports are favorably received, a similar system may be adopted for permanent use by WSGA.

 At the other end of the wardrobe, towards the window, is the tier of drawers, topped by a large ledge where the telephone will be located. This recess has four corner shelves also.
 Close to the ceiling over this recessed bureau top, are two shelf-sized closets with doors which open and swing upwards. Their size and location indicate linen closets.
 On the window side of the room and flanking the narrow radiator are book shelves running window-ledge high along that side of the room. Many rooms need nothing but radiators for completion.
 The dining rooms and lounges in Simmons Hall are further behind in completion, although plans call for their full availability with the opening of the fall semester.

Dining Halls
 The dining halls are located on the ground floor which, in Simmons, is the basement level. The lounges are located immediately above the dining rooms in the east wing of the building. Windows covering more than one-half of the east wall space of the lounge look out onto the terrace and what will be a grassy bank.
 Work is being furthered on Simmons Hall for fall occupancy, with McElwain close behind. When both are finished they will be joined by an underground tunnel connecting them at their closest point underneath the driveway from Shortlidge road.

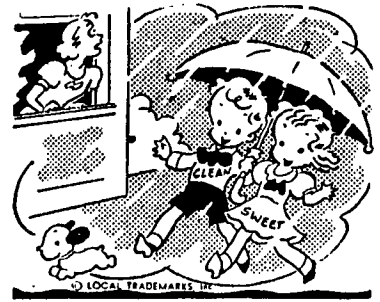
