Student activities will be described briefly by leaders in various fields in a mass meeting sponsored by All-College Cabinet, student governing body, in Recreation Hall at 8:10 p.m. Monday.

William Lawless, All-College President and chairman of the program committee, has arranged for speakers on student government, Interfraternity and Pan-Hellenic Councils, sports, publications and hat societies, all interspersed with entertainment.

Lawless, himself, will discuss student government; George Chapman, IFC president, will speak about fraternities; and sororities will be treated by Adelaide Finkelson, Pan-Hel president.

Joseph Colone, football captain and Men's Athletic Association president, will talk about sports; publications will be presented by Lewis Stone, Collegian editor; and the nature, functions and purposes of campus honor societies will be explained by William Bon-sall, president of Hat Societies Council.

Entertainment between the five-minute talks will be provided by Henry Glass, campus comic who has appeared in many Thespians and Players productions. Arrangements are being completed for musical interludes.

PSCA to Sponsor Sophomore Mixer

A mixer for incoming students and sponsored by the Penn State Christian Association will be held Tuesday night in Old Main and on the lawn in front of it. In case of rain, the gathering will be held in Schwab Auditorium.

Lasting from 8:15 to 10:30 p.m., the mixer will feature Thespians skits directed by J. Ewing "Sock" Kennedy, and the College cheerleaders.

Huff Hall's orchestra will play for round dancing on the Old Main porches. On the fourth floor of the building Chauncey's Lang's band will lead square dancing. Table games will be set up in 304 Old Main, the office of the CA, where students may also participate in group singing.

Co-chairmen of the affair are Betty Jean Sammons and Bob Wine.

President's Talk Opens Program

A welcome talk by James Milholland, acting president, and viewing the movie "Your College" at a mass assembly in Recreation Hall Sunday night opened Orientation Week and life on the Penn State campus for more than 2700 sophomores and other new students.

A week crowded with scheduling and counseling sessions; scholastic, aptitude and psychological tests; health exams; mixers; informational programs; and registration follows for the new students.

Day-by-day schedules, distributed at the Sunday meeting, are to be followed strictly by each student, according to Arthur R. Warnock, Dean of Men and chairman of the Orientation Week committee.

More than 100 upperclass student leaders are participating in the orientation program as counselors. Under their guidance the newcomers will receive their first introduction to the Penn State campus.

Special evening events are the student government program in Recreation Hall at 8:15 p.m. Monday and the PSCA mixer in Old Main and on its front lawn from 8:15 to 10:30 Tuesday night.
