

Publications Work Open To All

Open to students of all curricula are five undergraduate publications, including the Daily Collegian, campus newspaper, La Vie, College yearbook; Froth, humor magazine; Critique, literary periodical; and the Student Handbook.

Penn State Engineer, undergraduate technical journal, recruits its staff from those in Engineering curricula; and the IFC News Letter, published by the Interfraternity Council, from fraternity members.

Meetings of candidates for all publications will be announced in the Daily Collegian shortly after the beginning of classes. Details concerning requirements, type of work, and further meetings will be announced by the individual publications at those times.

Students joining the Daily Collegian staff as candidates are immediately assigned routine reporting, copy editing, and morgue jobs. They are selected for the Sophomore Board at the beginning of the second semester on the basis of ability and interest. After training and practice on the Sophomore and Junior Boards, editors are selected at the end of their junior year, serving as member of the Senior Board, the policy determining group of the paper.

Headed this year by Editor Lewis Stone, the Daily Collegian strives to reflect the opinions of the student body on its editorial pages, to present campus news in a clear and unbiased manner, and to further its slogan, "For a Better Penn State."

this year under the direction of John English, editor-in-chief. Presenting in words and pictures all that goes into making the academic, social, and athletic doings of the year. La Vie is presented to graduating seniors as a traditionay memento of their collegiate careers. Opportunities for training and experience in administrative and editorial work, writing, photography, and art are offered by work on the yearbook.

Froth, nationally prominent in the college comic field, publishes original humorous stories, jokes, and cartoons in addition to regular features including a candid-photo page and gossip column. Co-Editors Arthur Ward and Frank Philippbar plan an early issue, available October 5.

Creative Writing

Candidates for Critique will have an opportunity to publish creative writing and to review campus and national affairs on the editorial staff, or to receive training in business and art positions. Critique, edited by David Eldridge, will accept articles on current campus issues.

Student Handbook, published

by the students and sponsored by the Penn State Christian Association, is designed primarily to help new students become acclimated to campus life. Candidates are accepted in editorial and business staffs in the Spring.

Technical Articles

Serving as a medium for the publication of undergraduate technical article, the Penn State Engineer also offers biographical sketches of notables in the world of science, campus snapshots, and a humor column, "Sly Drools." George Bearer heads the editorial staff for the coming year.

for the power plant are a boiler feed pump, ash hoist equipment and a bulldozer for moving coal.

Several campus utility projects were undertaken during the summer, including the construction of a radio aerial system which will provide an aerial outlet in each room at Nittany dorms, and a new fire alarm system in McAllister Hall and Woman's building. A steam line was built from the Nittany dorms' heating plant to the Pollock Circle cafeteria, which is being used as a recreation center.

A ten-foot wide trench, to carry utilities to the Foods building and the water tunnel now under construction, is being dug across Route 322 to the vicinity of the power plant.
