Booters Sharpen Attack For Opener Against Army

"Keep the ball on the carpet." That's this week's motto for the Lion soccermen as Coach Bill Jeffrey has his proteges sharpening their passing attack in preparation for this Friday's inaugural booting contest against Army.

The veteran Scotsman puts particular stress on accurate passes. He says: "A good pass is just as vital in soccer as it is in basketball. You have to make sure that one of your own men gets the ball instead of the opponent."

Using his first team defense and pitting them against his first team's offensive line, the Lion mentor has his charges going through hectic daily workouts on the golf course practice field.

TWO TEAMS

Two full teams will make the trek up the Hudson river to West Point as the Lion Jayvees tangle with the Army juniors preliminary to the varsity skirmish.

Jeffrey has a strong forward wall in the making with Ted Lieb, Harry Little, George Phillips, Captain Dean Witmer and Hal Hackman being the mainstays in recent practice sessions.

Bill Kraybill, a member of Jeffrey's 1945 combine and a junior varsity performer last season,

has shown great improvement and may earn a starting berth in one of the halfback posts. Joe Lane, a potential All-American in a year or so, may perform at the other halfback position with Ralph Hosterman filling in the third halfback slot.

GIBSON

Another goalie, Jimmy Gibson, turned out for practice sessions last week and Jeffrey now has a trio of goalies on whom he may call for duty. Ed Watson of State College and Jim Doman of Lancaster are now vying for starting honors.

Two new fullbacks also are pushing last year's starters. They are "Red" Emig, a letter-winner

Hardest blow of the weekend was Alabama's upset at the hands of Tulane. All four yogis took a beating on that one.

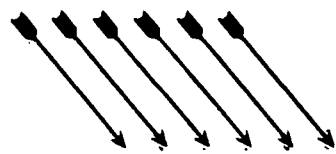
