that body can be made functional.

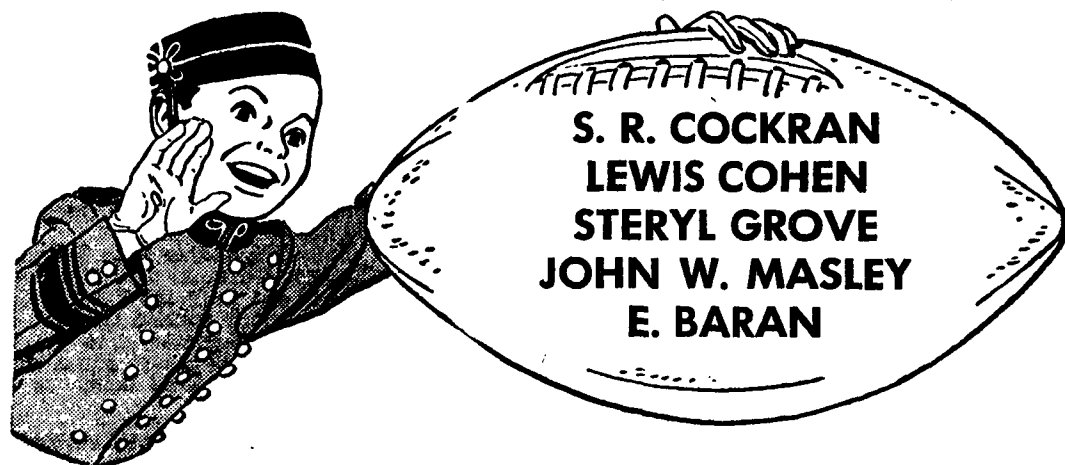
