Tickets for the series are \$3 each. Single admissions are priced at \$1. Both of these prices include federal tax. General admission season tickets may be exchanged for reserved seats at the Student Union desk on Thursday, according to Mr. Hugh G. Pyle, chairman of the forum.

The Community Forum is sponsored by the cooperative efforts of 19 community groups and institutions. The first in the series of five lectures will be presented November 4.
