9801 Enrollment Sets New Record

Student enrollment for the current semester totals 9801, a new record. W. S. Hoffman, Dean of Admissions and Registrar, said today. Last Fall, 8400 students were enrolled.

The final figure includes 7971 men and 1830 women. Candidates for bachelor degrees total 8620 while 1002 students are in the Graduate School, 170 are special students, and 9 are registered as Two-Year students in Agriculture.

There are 2440 seniors, 3263 juniors, and 2873 sophomores among the students registered on campus. An additional 713 sophomores are enrolled at four cen-
