

# Jeffreyemen Face Penn

A 17-man contingent of Lion soccermen will travel to Philadelphia tomorrow to engage Penn's Quakers in the "Turkey Bowl" for the Jeffreyemen's last booting contest this year.

The booting Lions have much in common with their grid brothers. Both sport a 6-1-1 record to date. Both in seeking their seventh win of the current campaign close their respective 1948 seasons this week.

Their single losses were upsets while both their ties were against powers in their respective sports. Both are favored to return to State College at the long end of the score this week.

The Lions, who were victors over Army, 2-0; Bucknell, 2-1; Syracuse, 5-1; Maryland, 1-0; Colgate, 4-2; and Temple, 4-1, should have little trouble in trouncing the underdog Quakers.

### PENN RECORD

One of the bright spots of Penn's record to date, which shows 5 wins, 2 losses and one tie, was a 2-1 triumph over Navy, a team which handed the Blue and White its only loss this year.

Penn and Army battled to a 2-2 deadlock while Swarthmore and Cornell triumphed over the Quakers by 2-0 and 3-0 scores, respectively. Army succumbed to the Lions earlier in the year while the Nittanymen tied Cornell, 2-2.

Victims of the Red and Blue

were Haverford, 8-3; Yale, 4-3; Princeton, 6-1; and West Chester, 3-2.

Still overjoyed with the Lions' surprise win over Temple last weekend, Coach Bill Jeffrey says: "It was a wonderful game. One of the most inspiring exhibitions of soccer I have seen in quite a while."

Five booters will play their valedictory contest for the Blue and White. Four of the five are starters while the other is a top relief performer.

Dependable team captain Dean Witmer, capable defenseman Frank Taucher, accurate-passing Hal Hackman and lanky Ed Taggart, star goalie, are the senior starters who'll play their last game against Penn while hard-kicking fullback Jim Kline also bows out of the collegiate soccer picture.

One of the strongest incentives for a triumph tomorrow will be the Penn battle last year. Although the Lions conquered the Quakers, 3-2, they lost the service of their star high scoring performer, Ken Hosterman, who broke his leg during the game.

Coach Jeffrey commenting on the Penn tilt said: "It would be awful to think that we couldn't beat them. But there are days where you wear your left shoe on the right foot and that makes it tough for you."
