

Women Plan Swim Meets

Organizational meetings of coeds interested in participating in national swimming telegraphics for women will be held in White Hall pool at 7:30 p.m. today and at 7 p.m. tomorrow for those unable to attend the first meeting.

Participation is not restricted to members of the swimming club, although the latter sponsors telegraphics, and all girls interested in speed swimming are urged to report to one of the meetings. The regular swimming club program will be carried on as usual.

Dates for the two telegraphic meets have been set as sometime in the latter part of February. Best times of the swimmers will then be sent to a host school, selected by district and previous record in telegraphics.

The College team was winner of the Eastern Region last year accumulating 80.5 points. The team gained first, second and fourth place in the 40 yd. crawl, third place in the 40 yd. back crawl and breast stroke, a tie for first in the 100 yd. crawl, and third place in the 100 yd. breast.

The team secured fourth place in the Nationals topped by Purdue, Michigan State and Skidmore. Lee Ann Wagner, last year's president of WRA, placed first in the 40 yd. crawl, tied for second in the 5 yd. medley relay, and placed second in the 100 yd. free style relay.

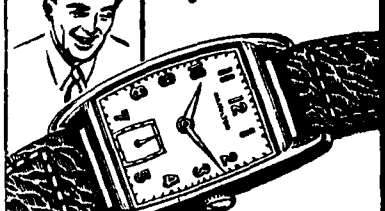

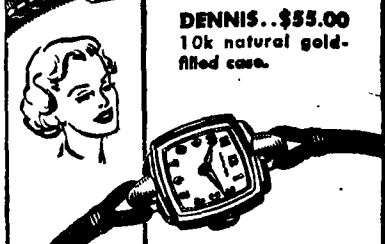
