After his ring debut Drazenovich went on to triumph the next six times he entered the squared circle. His greatest victory came in the final bout of the EIBA tournament at Virginia when he knocked out his Coast Guard opponent after only 20 seconds of the first round had elapsed.

Benglian reached his pinnacle of success in the spring of 1946 when as a freshman at Penn State he won the Eastern 127-pound crown at West Point.

A back injury kept the southpaw out of the ring his sophomore year but last season the stylish Benglian went undefeated in dual meets although tied once by Syracuse's national champion Gerry Auclair in one of the harder fought bouts of last year's Rec Hall boxing program.

With Benglian and Drazenovich forming the nucleus of the 1949 Lions, Houck expects a promising season although his charges encounter some of the nation's best ring aggregations in Army, Virginia and Wisconsin.

ably are lanky Paul Smith, a 175-pound battler, and veteran Jack Sheehe, who'll bow out of the intercollegiate picture at the end of this season.
