Jack Dreibelbis, winner of his only two outings, Jim Walker and Kryder Mattern were chosen as possibilities for the 128-pound class, as were Al Fasnacht, Don Arbuckle and Dick "Bucky" Edinger for the 136-pound division.

One of the three men, Larry Shallcross, Mickey Silverman, or George Thomas, will fight in Maurey's post at 145 pounds, while either Bill Santel or Lee Perna will tangle with Lehigh's Eric Erikson, 155-pounder.

Bob Hetrick and Johnny Peters will represent the Nittanies at 165 pounds, and Bob Markle and Bill Corman are both primed for 175-pound battles.

Homer Barr and Wally Chambers are the heavyweight nomi-

nees, with the latter in readiness to see varsity action if necessary.

The Lehigh grapplers invade State College with a season's record of five wins and one defeat. Their only loss was to Cornell, 14-13, a team that the States beat, 24-6, while at full strength. When Lehigh battled the Big Red, its two Eastern champions, Dick Kelsey and Jim Jackson, were absent.

Coach Billy Sheridan's mat forces are captained by big Ed Erikson, one of the best 165-pounders in the East. Erikson failed in his bid to retain his championship in last year's EIWA tourney, but is the holder of a clean slate in competition this year.

The Brown and White roster will include Filipos, 121 pounds; Herman Bastianelli, 128; Kelsey, 136; John Mahoney, 145; Eric Erikson, 155; Captain Ed Erikson, 165; Jackson or John Morgan, 175; and either LaSasso or Berndt at heavyweight.

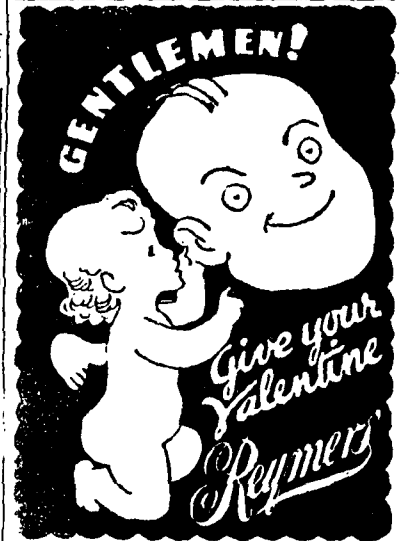
