Fencers Triumph Over Temple, 15-12

Penn State's fencers scored their second win of the season Saturday by defeating Temple, 15-12, in Philadelphia.
 After losing the foil, 6-3, State came back to take both the epee and sabre events by the same 6-3 margin. Rolf Ward and Rex Dyer were the Lions' outstanding performers as both captured three straight matches in the epee and sabre contests respectively. State's Art Ward won both his jousts in the epee class.
 Co-captains Harry McCarty and Paul Younkin each took two out of three matches for the Lions. Both their losses were by a 5-4 count. Temple's Stan Schachter defeated McCarty,
 John Kochalka, and Dave Meier to become the Owl's only triple winner.
 Coach Arthur Meyer's charges have only two meets—Cornell and the Intercollegiate—left on the schedule. The Big Red invade Rec Hall Saturday while New York will be the site of the second meet.

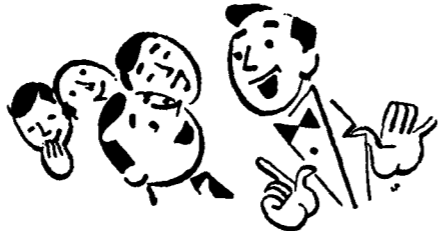

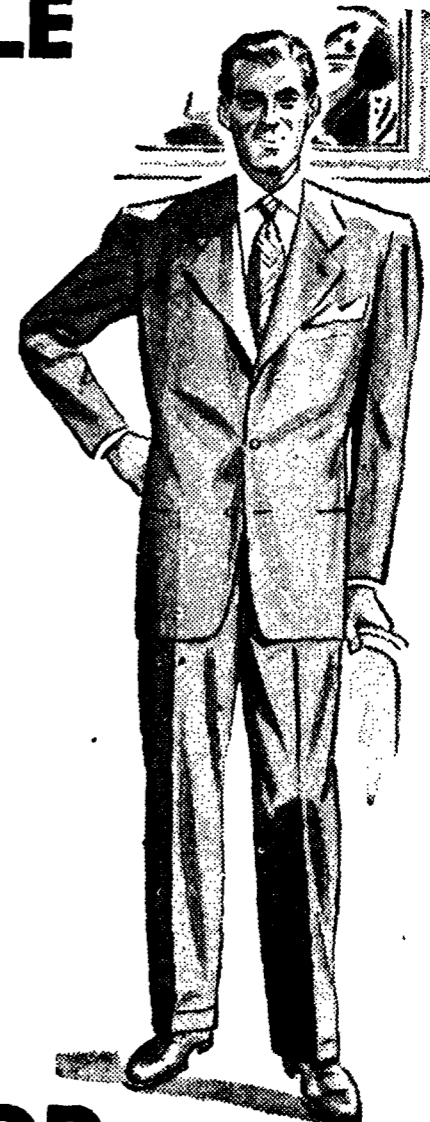
