all college elections in which "politics already existed."

Receptive to the above proposal, Harold Brown, then Lion clique chairman, agreed to a joint steering committee meeting of the two parties to discuss Keller's suggestion.

From this meeting the two groups passed a resolution stating that they were in favor of injecting politics into all campus elections in which politics already existed, with some modifications. Sunday night's action indicates, however, that the Lion steering committee has since decided to veto the proposal and the party as a whole followed the same course of action.

Since success of such a plan hinges on its adoption by both parties, the State clique is expected to follow suit and also reject the proposal at its meeting Sunday.

Both parties will meet to make preliminary nominations for the April elections Sunday.

### Selsam to Speak On Soviet History

Russian history will be the subject of a talk by Dr. Paul Selsam, chairman of the history department, in the first of a series of discussions on Russian American relations. At the regular meeting of the Christian Association in 304 Old Main at 7 p.m. today. Dr. Selsam will discuss various factors which helped to shape the present policy of Russia.

Dr. John De Nova will speak on U. S. foreign policy at the next meeting of the series which will be held on March 30. The general purpose of these meetings is to increase understanding of Russia.
