## Recent Amendment Results in Revision Of WRA Constitution

WRA Executive Board has changed several clauses of its Constitution to have it agree with the new amendment concerning intramural officers.

Section I of the WRA Constitution now states that the Executive Board of the Association shall consist of student members as follows: (a) the three officers of WRA which includes the president, vice-president, and secretary, (b) the intramural chairman, the junior assistant intramural chairman, the club activities chairman, and the publicity chairman. Under clause (c) would be included one sophomore and two freshmen representatives while (d) now consists of the senior counselor.

Revision of the Constitution was made in order to divide the work of organizing and conducting intramural sports between three officers instead of two. The Executive Board will outline the duties of the new officers at a future meeting.
