## Pinnings No Longer Link in Chain—Poll Shows

What's in a fraternity pin?

According to a recent survey, 16 of 1100 interviewed girls consider a pin as meaning an addition to their collections, and 11 others wear them merely to decorate their clothes.

Fast debunking of the old-fashioned idea at the College that being pinned is the same as being engaged, the survey shows that a majority of 511 coeds consider pinning to mean merely going steady. Only 373 of the 1100 college women hold the opinion that wearing a fraternity pin is the same as wearing a ring. Interestingly enough, 158 replied that it merely meant "friendship."

## Chimes Arranges Coming Merger With Western Honorary

Chimes, junior women's honorary, has made plans to merge with the Key and Scroll, California's junior women's honorary.

Chimes, which recently went national, is composed of students from Temple, Ohio State, University of West Virginia, and Penn State, charter chapters; and Bradley University, which was admitted to membership at last June's convention.
