

## V-Ball Teams Extend Streaks

Four independent volleyball teams won their third consecutive contests in Tuesday's action on the Rec Hall courts.

Torpedoes defeated Sword Fishes, 13-15, 15-5 and 15-5, and Directors won by forfeit over Sea Lions, for their third win in League One action. Ridge Runners and Nittany Co-op remained in a tie for first place in League Four, the Runners measuring the Red Flashes, 15-5, 14-16 and 15-8 and the Co-op trouncing Broken Hearts, 15-3 and 15-3.

In the two fraternity games played Tuesday, Theta Kappa Phi-B defeated Alpha Tau Omega-B, 15-13 and 15-8, and Beta Sigma Rho-B edged Delta Tau Delta-B, 13-15, 15-3 and 20-18.

In other independent matches, Matilda Chi forfeited to Century Boys; Bachelors trimmed Hotel Greeters, 15-7, 3-15 and 15-10; Atherton Hall Men won their first tilt by surprising Miners, 15-5, 15-17 and 15-8.

Woodchoppers topped Ceramics, 15-12, 10-15 and 15-3; Ale and Quail took over Penn Haven-A, 15-7, 7-15 and 15-13; Dorm 37 fell before Penn Haven-B, 15-10, 7-15 and 15-11.

Monday's all-fraternity program was featured by the third victories of Delta Tau Delta-A, Phi Sigma Kappa-A and Theta Kappa Phi-A.

## Sigma Nu Grappler Makes Bid For 175-Pound IM Mat Title

Bill Eggert, Sigma Nu's 165-pound wrestling champ, filed his claim for the 175-pound intramural mat title Tuesday night and proved he's in good enough shape to make the division a fight all the way.

Eggert came out of the in-activity to pin Ed Booth, Kappa Delta Rho, in one minute and 30 seconds of their bout at Rec Hall. The victory moved him into the quarter-finals of the tourney.

But in a season of quick falls, Eggert's time was eclipsed by three other pins. Russ Wilson, Delta Theta Sigma, slapped down

crew before losing, 15-12, 12-15 and 15-7; Phi Sigma Kappa trounced Alpha Chi Sigma, 15-3 and 15-1; Theta Kappa Phi crushed Tau Phi Delta, 15-10 and 15-6.

Phi Kappa Psi-A easily defeated Phi Sigma Delta-A, 15-6 and 15-5; Delta Upsilon-A forfeited to Alpha Phi Delta; Kappa Delta Rho-A rallied to down Delta Chi-A, 5-15, 15-12 and 15-9; Sigma Chi-A won by forfeit over Alpha Gamma Rho-A.

In other tilts, Phi Epsilon Pi-A defeated Sigma Phi Epsilon-A, 15-11, 12-15 and 15-7; Beta Theta Pi-A made a strong comeback to beat Pi Kappa Phi-A, 4-15, 18-18 and 17-15; Sigma Pi-A forfeited to Lambda Chi Alpha-A; Delta Sigma Phi bowed to Phi Delta Theta-A, 16-14 and 15-2; Triangle trimmed Beta Sigma Rho-A, 15-6, 10-15 and 15-8.

Phi Delta Theta's John Thompson, in 40 seconds of a 135-pound brawl, and heavyweight Cal Di-Valerio, Phi Sigma Kappa, tied down Walt Rossman, Delta Theta Sigma, in a quick 1:17. In the independent squabbles, Barker, 175-pounder, downed Bob Mazer, in 54 seconds.

Although unable to pin their opponents, Wil Roth, Zeta Beta Tau, Jack Weidenman, Sigma Nu, and independent Orlo Barger captured top-sided decisions in fast tussles. Roth, in control of Rex Lord, Sigma Chi, through all three periods, scored a 9-0 victory, adding up two near-falls, a takedown, a reverse and time advantage. Weidenman bumped off Fred Schulze, Sigma Phi Epsilon, 7-1, in a 135-pound whistler. Barger outgrappled Herb Groff through six minutes and won, 7-1.

### MORE FALLS

Six other falls kept fans on their toes throughout the night. Fred Rodgers, Phi Gamma Delta, dropped Emil Suda, Alpha Tau Omega, in 43 seconds of the third stanza, but Jack McCall, Alpha

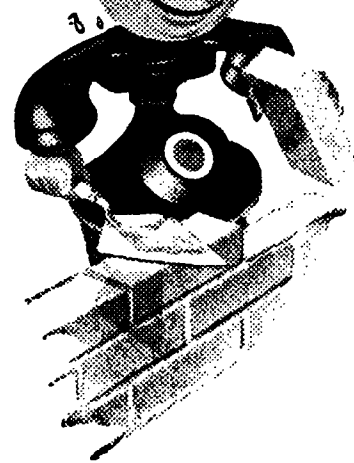

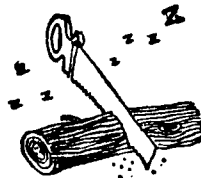
