

Senate Authorizes Air Force A 3,000 Testing Range

WASHINGTON—The Senate passed a bill yesterday authorizing the Air Force to set up a 3,000-mile testing range for guided missiles. The Senate made changes in the bill which had already passed the House which will require compromise with the House before the bill goes to the President. As it stands now, the measure authorizes a top cost of 75 million dollars for the testing range.

VA Cut Recommended

WASHINGTON — A cut of more than 500 million dollars in the amount President Truman asked for the Veterans Administration was recommended by the House Appropriations Committee. The cut was one of several recommended by the committee in a money bill for 28 so-called independent agencies. Also subject to a possible cut was the Atomic Energy Commission.

Leftists Reject Plan

GERMANY—Germany's Leftist Social Democratic Party has rejected the Allied recommendation for a states rights constitution. This rejection dimmed the party's hopes for the early formation of a West German Republican Government. The party's consent would be needed to secure a two-thirds vote to adopt a west German Constitution.
