Elizabeth Lee, Missionary To Speak at WSGA Convention

WSGA is making final preparations for its annual WSGA Convocation in 10 Sparks at 7 p.m. Thursday. Miss Elizabeth Lee will be guest speaker.

Miss Lee received her B.A. and M.A. at Mount Holyoke College and did further graduate work at Columbia University, Hartford Seminary and the School of International Studies at Geneva,

Switzerland.

During the period from 1915 to 1924 she served as a missionary in Japan under the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society and as principal of Happy Hill School, a high school for girls in Fukuoka.

From 1925 to 1935 Miss Lee worked in the field of international Christian relations, lecturing, conducting forums and writing articles. During the next five years she acted as Corresponding Secretary of the Philadelphia Branch of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, with administrative responsibility for the work of the Society in South America.

Extensive Traveling

Her traveling experience includes two trips to the Far East—Japan, Korea and China, five trips to Europe, twice as a member of the American Seminar under Dr. Sherwood Eddy, studying in England, France, Germany, Poland, Austria, Czechoslovakia, Russia, Finland, Sweden, Denmark and the Near East and two trips to South America.

Church Office

In July, 1940, Miss Lee was elected an Executive Secretary of the Board of Missions and Church Extensions of the Methodist Church with administrative duties in Latin America, Europe and North Africa. Miss Lee still holds this position and in 1941-42 traveled over 35,000 miles throughout Latin America.
